THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL...

It's easy to become overconfident when we read this week's Parable of the Sower. After all, we regularly attend Mass on Sunday, so we must be among *'the seeds which have fallen on rich soil'*, right?



That may be true, but the *rest* of the parable reminds us that the world is constantly trying to choke our faith, to scorch our heart, to distract us, and to separate us from God. In fact, our modern culture seems to do this with a focused, *intentional* effort.

To remain close to God, we need to stand firm in our faith with a similar focused, *intentional* effort.

St Paul tells us that the fruits of the Spirit are love, joy, peace, patience, and much more (*Gal 5:22-23*) – but to enjoy these gifts we need to remain on our guard so that the world does not steal away our peace, our joy, or worst of all – our love.

We need to spend at least a few minutes each day 'actively rejecting' the message that the modern world would like us to accept. Place a Bible near your bed and read a page or two of a Gospel each night, so that you can hear from God each evening. Join a small group or ministry to connect with people who share your faith. Attend a *weekday* Mass and experience a smaller, more intimate setting. Come to the upcoming Philippians Bible study and become familiar with some of the most beautiful passages in the entire Bible (*see below*).

Repel this world's falsehoods and anxiety by spending more time with God's loving Word.

PROTECTING YOUR CHILD

Have you noticed the confusing messages that are marketed to your child recently? These lies are aimed *directly* at the formation of your child's view of the world, and they can affect their confidence, their personality, and their life choices.



As their guardian, you'd gladly stand in the way of *anything* that tries to harm your child. But what about as they grow older, or are out on their own?

The only *lifelong* protection for your child is for them to have the confidence that comes from a firm foundation in their faith, in the unalterable truth that God loves them, and in the fact that He has a unique plan for their well-being.

A parent will always have the *primary role* in shaping their child's faith, and our Religious Education program will assist you by teaching them about God's truth, about His plan for them, and about His unwavering devotion to helping them lead the best possible life, both now and in Heaven.

If your child is in *first grade or above*, please register them *this week* for classes that will strengthen their faith and prepare them for either First Communion or the Sacrament of Confirmation.

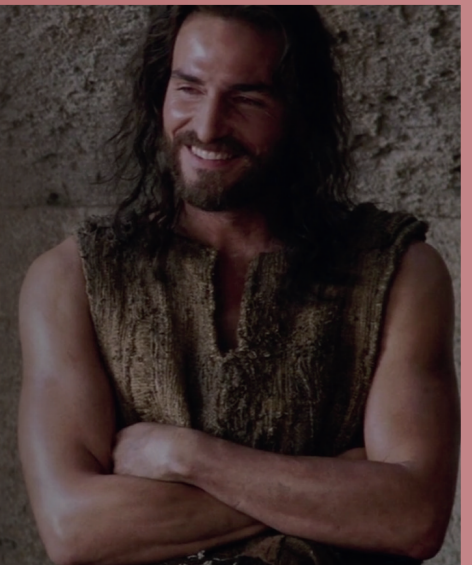
