THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL...

Before we get to the *content* of This Week's Gospel, lets first ask ourselves who *wrote* it.

The passage comes from the Gospel of Mark, so it may seem like the answer is simply 'Mark'. But that's only *part* of the answer. The full answer for this (and every) passage in the Bible is that it was *written by the Holy Spirit*, and *through* a human author.

This is the reason that we can trust the Bible to be completely true. It was written by the perfect mind (and loving heart) of God. And if we ever forget that God is the true author of the Gospels, we may fall into a trap that was described by St. Augustine:

"If you believe what you <u>like</u> in the gospels, and reject what you <u>don't</u> like, it is not the <u>gospel</u> you believe, but yourself."

This is precisely what our modern world would love to do – to re-write the Gospels, removing all the parts that are 'difficult'. In short, to create a false 'faith' that caters to man's fallen nature.

But if we trust God, then we know that *every single part* of the Gospel is there for a reason – to guide us toward the best life possible, and eventually to heaven. We may stumble at times, but the Bible is perfect, true, and always shining a light *in the right direction* so that we can grow towards God.

St. Paul knew how important it was to hold on to the Gospel *exactly as it was given to us by God*. In his Letter to the Galatians, he said:

"There are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ. But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to that which we preached to you, let him be accursed."

St. Paul tells us that no one has the authority to change what God has given us. **No one**.

So how does this connect with the *content* of This Week's Gospel?

Jesus says that he has placed us 'in charge' and given each of us work to do.

One of our responsibilities is to accept all of what Jesus has taught us, to know it, and to carry it within our hearts. This, the 'Deposit of Faith' which has been entrusted to us, needs to be guarded and kept safe, unchanged, and passed on to the next generation without error.

God's wisdom does not change over time, and His truth does not expire.

Be Watchful. Be Alert. Preserve the Faith.


